



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. How do I schedule private confession?

A. You may contact Fr. Matthew Moriak at FrMatthewLL@hotmail.com to schedule private confession. You may partake of the Holy Eucharist by going to private confession at least once a year AND participating in general confession on a monthly basis. General confession is held on the second Saturday immediately following Vespers. However, we should try to not view confession in a minimalist manner. More frequent private confession is encouraged and recommended for your well-being and relationship with God.

Q. When do you have Church School?

A. Church School is held from September through May. Students are dismissed immediately following Communion. They venerate the cross and exit through the main church entrance. Teachers and safety guards escort students to the Religious Education building (across the alley). Sunday School ends at 12 noon, at which time teachers escort their children to the fellowship area.

Q. Why is a pledge required for membership at St. Gregory's?

A. The pledge signifies your commitment of faith to God alone. While the Old Testament taught a 10% tithe, Christ implored us to sell everything and follow Him. As in early times, the tithes of the faithful allowed the Church to carry on with its work: supporting the clergy, caring for the poor and other ministries. The same is true today. If St. Gregory's did not know what parishioner intentions were, it would be very difficult to care for our clergy and carry out our ministries in a responsible, consistent manner.

Q. Why Does St. Gregory's ask for my participation in a Church Ministry?

A. Our pledge to God is three-fold: time, treasures and talent. We are blessed with many gifts from God, and His work must be carried out by the faithful, Therefore, St. Gregory's asks that you involve yourself in a ministry out of the dozens we provide.
